WIRRAL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHT SOF WAY

WIRRAL (THE WARRENS) MODIFICATION ORDER NO. 1 2009

This Order is made by Wirral Borough Council under Section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to the Council that the Wirral Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in Sections 53(3)(b) and (c)(i), namely the expiration of a period of time such that the enjoyment by the public of the way during that period raises a presumption that the way has been dedicated as a public path and the discovery by the Council of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to the Council) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates.

The Council have consulted with every local authority whose area includes the land to which the Order relates.

The Wirral Borough Council hereby order that:-

1. For the purposes of this Order that relevant date is 20th March 2009.
2. The Wirral Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way shall be modified as described in the Schedule below and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the day it is confirmed and may be cited as Wirral (The Warrens) Modification No. 1 Order 2009

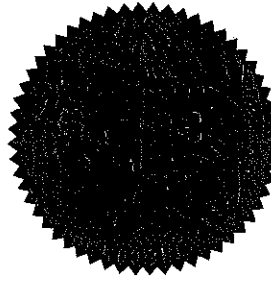
SCHEDULE

Modification of the Definitive Map

Description of path to be added

A footpath indicated on the attached map by a broken black line running in a generally north westerly direction through an area of land known as The Warrens for a length of 167.8 metres or thereabouts with a width throughout of 2 metres starting at a point marked A on Thingwall Road East at The Warrens entrance (grid reference 275852) and terminating at a point marked D where it joins a permissive path within Arrowe Park (grid reference 274854).

Between points A and B the footpath runs along an unadopted tarmac highway for length of 46.7 metres or thereabouts. Between points B and C the footpath runs along a route marked with paving stones for a length of 56.9 metres or thereabouts and between points C and D it runs along a route predominantly covered in hardcore for a length of 64.2 metres or thereabouts.
