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#### 1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 In accordance with Regulation 17 (1) and 18 (4) of the Town & Country Planning (Local Development) Regulations 2004, this document sets out details of the consultation undertaken by the Council between 19 May and 30 June 2006 on the Draft Supplementary Planning Document 'Designing For Self Contained Flat Development And Conversions'.
- 1.2 The Draft Supplementary Planning Document was prepared following initial consultation during November and December 2005 to provide a further opportunity for public involvement. Comments were invited on the content of the draft document and the accompanying sustainability appraisal report.
- 1.3 This consultation report is available for inspection alongside the adopted Supplementary Planning Document.

#### 2 THE CONSULTATION PROCESS

- 2.1 In accordance with the Draft Statement of Community Involvement, <u>www.wirral.gov.uk/ldf/ldfsci1.asp</u>, initial consultation on options to include in the proposed Supplementary Planning Document took place between 18 November and 30 December 2005. The results helped to prepare the contents of the Draft Supplementary Planning Document and the associated Sustainability Appraisal Reports which were published for further public consultation during 19 May and 30 June 2006.
- 2.2 A series of letters inviting comments were sent to a list of contacts drawn from the Unitary Development Plan database and Area Forum representatives. The letters invited comments on the contents of the draft the Supplementary Planning Document. Stakeholders, general and statutory consultation bodies, Ward Councillors and MPs were consulted in writing and supplied with a copy of the consultation documents.
- 2.3 Copies of the Draft Supplementary Planning Document and the Sustainability Report were placed on the Council's website and can be viewed at <a href="http://www.wirral.gov.uk/ldf/ldfsp.asp">http://www.wirral.gov.uk/ldf/ldfsp.asp</a> Paper copies of the documents were also made available at the public counter of the Technical Services Department offices and local libraries throughout the Borough.
- 2.4 Press advertisements were placed in two local newspapers, the Liverpool Daily Post on 19 May 2006 and the Wirral Globe on 24 May 2006.

#### 3 SUMMARY OF RESPONSES.

- 3.1 The consultation on the draft Supplementary Planning Document drew 25 responses.
- 3.2 A summary of the main issues raised in the representations received and the comments of the Local Planning Authority on how they have been addressed in the final SPD's are contained in the following table.
