Introduction

The Arno is situated in a residential area of Oxton and consists of a formal rose garden, herbaceous border, lawns, shrub beds and mature trees. A naturalised area consisting of gorse and trees is located within the site of a former sandstone quarry. The site is bounded by Storeton Road, private housing and the Oxton Fields.

Pre- Arrival

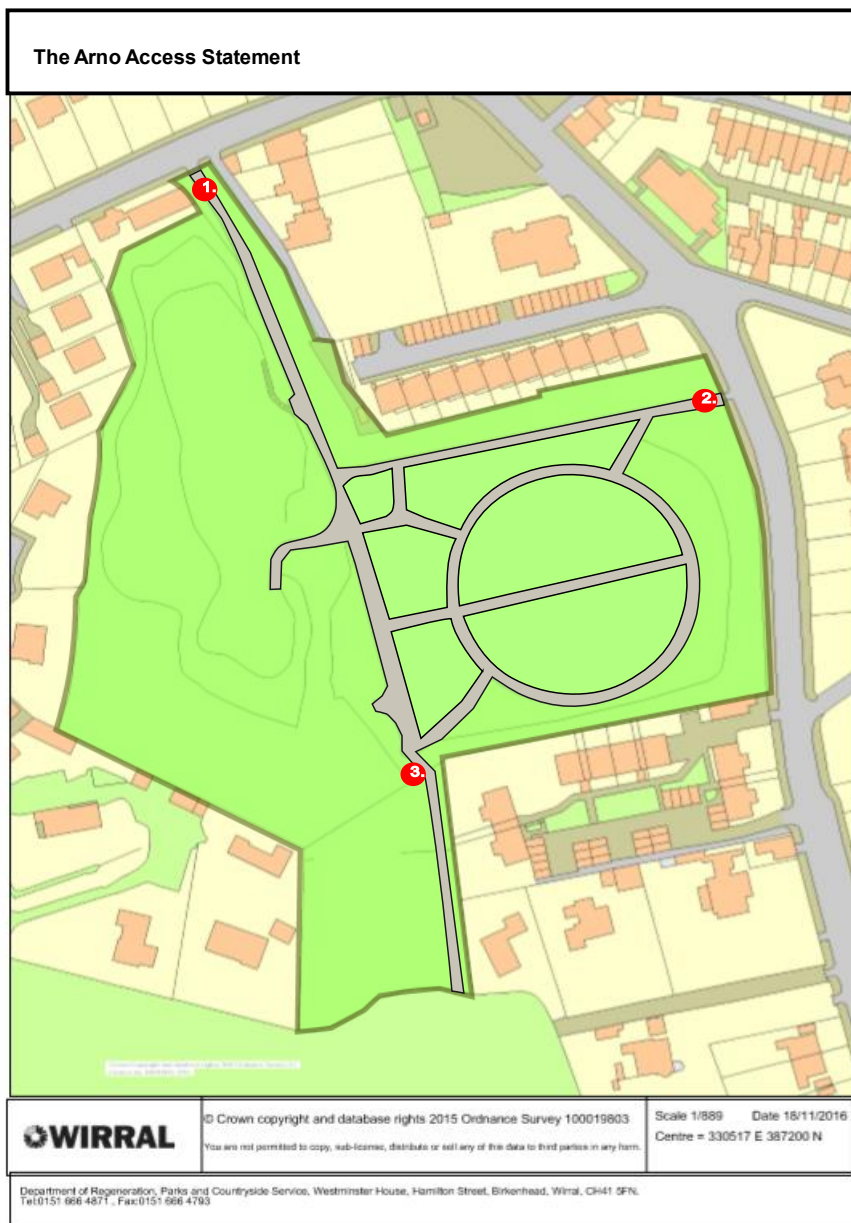
The Arno is located on a main bus route with the nearest stop located on Ingestre Road. Within 50m of a park entrance, Train timetables for this station <http://www.merseyrail.org/>

The Ingestre Road and Storeton Road entrances are suitable for wheelchair users; the woodland area within the site is unsuitable for wheelchair users.

The park consists of steady inclines across the landscape; the paths around the park are surfaced with Tarmac, all of which are suitable for wheelchair users.

Oxton Fields – An informal entrance, consisting of a desire line path, leads from the fields up the hill into the rear of the park.
