The implementation of the Phase 1 Site Development Plan for Birkenhead Town Centre will see the construction of circa 150,000 sq.ft (13,935 sq.m) of new office accommodation on a sustainable brownfield location in the heart of the Town. Further phases of the plan, which will be delivered over a 15-year period, will result in further office developments, potentially a hotel and retail space being constructed adjacent to new mix tenure homes on Europa Boulevard. The vision is to create an inter-generational community open to all with provision of at least 20% affordable homes. The office and commercial floorspace will sit beside a re-	N/A	N/A	N/A	N/A

provide market within a new quality public realm incorporating improved pedestrian and cycle facilities to, from and within the regenerated centre. The development will also be served by Conway Street Bus Interchange and Conway Park Railway Station. Future population change in Wirral will be driven by a significant increase in the number and proportion of older residents, with the population aged 65+ expected to increase by 30% from 70,000 in 2019 to 91,900 in 2035, placing specific pressure on delivery of accommodation within sustainable locations with immediate and easy access to amenity and services. The plans for a regenerated Birkenhead Town Centre will ensure that it is well placed to help meet this demand. Accessibility will be an important consideration from the project's inception to delivery and the Growth Company's chosen construction partner, Morgan Sindall will ensure that equality implications are an integral part of their plans. Equality implications were a key part of the procurement process when MUSE was chosen as the Council's Growth Company delivery partner. During the course of developing this Site Development Plan a wide-ranging consultation exercise was undertaken. These were held in accessible locations and

targeted to as many stakeholder groups as was possible. It is recognised that the Public Sector Equality Duty is an on-going consideration and this EIA will be reviewed and amended when necessary. The Council will also work with chosen partners to ensure that equality implications are considered at all stages.
