The group has met since September 2021 to review progress to the development of the PNA and engagement processes.

The results of the surveys are reported to the group, and be within the draft PNA, and will form a point of discussion for future learning and if issues arise during the survey timeframe.

Meetings with lead officer for EIA within Wirral Council will be held pre and post process with continued discussions on approach and content then approaches to maximise benefits and minimise any potential negative impacts

Section 7: How will consultation take place and by when?

The mandatory public consultation on Wirral's Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (2022-2025) will be hosted on Liverpool City Council who are hosting 9 Local Authorities using Survey Monkey platform.

The platform will host the 42 key questions about the public views on how they are using pharmacy services in the recent past - some questions taking account of the impact of COVID-19 - with survey running for November 2021.

The results will be analysed and presented as content within the final draft PNA.

Pre-survey meetings with PNA Development Group of partners and Healthwatch Wirral were held in order to inform process and content with adaptations made where necessary to mitigate any potential impacts and widen access where possible.

Agreement to report an EasyRead summary of results for the overall engagement report when developing the draft PNA content and when submitted to HWBB for approval.

Also, the results of the pharmacy services survey will be shared with specific groups who contributed to the survey (request of Healthwatch Wirral) once HWBB have approved the draft PNA for public consultation between April and June 2022.
