	For these reasons we believe that development should not be encouraged in this area by way of its designation as a residential area.
	Flood Water Storage Area
	The site has been recently identified in Wirral Council's SHLAA under designation 4022.
	"Site is entirely within Flood Zone 3, it is identified for flood water storage in the UDP and contains a priority habitat (Coastal and floodplain grazing marsh) so suitability is uncertain. No developer has come forward to support residential development on this site, therefore, achievability is uncertain."
	Given its designation as flood water storage and that it is almost entirely under-water for half of the year, the adjacent residents would be concerned that any permitted development on the land would endanger the existing properties in the flood zone from flooding as the field is part of the flood defence strategy for Leasowe. As the ongoing effects of climate change are being felt the residents of Leasowe are particularly vulnerable to sea level change as the majority of the area sits within Flood Zone 3 and the potential removal of flood water storage area would cause a number of residents to no longer feel safe to remain in the area.
	Part of the new Local Plan states:
	5.43 The priorities for Mid-Wirral are to:
	1. Maintain and enhance the open aspect of the northern coastline; the national and international importance of the inter-tidal foreshores and their supporting habitats, (part of which are in unfavourable recovering condition); and public access to the facilities and open spaces associated with the North Wirral Coastal Park, through the Interim Approach to Avoid and Mitigate Recreation Pressure in Wirral173and other policies in the plan in particular WS 5 Strategy for Green and Blue Infrastructure, Open Space, Biodiversity and Landscape Protection and WD 3 Biodiversity and Geodiversity Assets.

	We believe that by designating this land as residential it is in direct opposition to the above policies.
	Wildlife Habitat
	Many locals enjoy the field for the purpose of bird watching as it is a well-known habitat for a great variety of birds and amphibians. Any development around this area would require the removal of the lake that forms the main feature of the habitat in the field. Due to its annual flooding it is considered that the field provides a unique habitat in the area which has not been considered in the council's evidence base for the proposed changes and sets the area apart from other green space. As the field is very open on two of its boundaries it is considered that its amenity value for the public is higher than usual and forms a key part of the character of the area.
	Known protected species also inhabit the marsh including bats and great crested newts.
	Not Justified due to Existing Housing Development in the Local Area
	Immediately to the south of the field is a large housing development which is already under construction. 507 new homes are proposed to be built on former factory land which will significantly increase both traffic in the area and pressure on local infrastructure and services. As there is little infrastructure in Leasowe, the local residents are reliant on Moreton for local shops, schools and services. This current development will strain this infrastructure and it is considered that any further development that may be permitted in the immediate area would drastically change its character and cause damage to its already stretched services.
	Requests
	Given these arguments we would request that the marsh be afforded Nature Area status in the new local plan similar to the adjacent Ditton lane Nature Area and have its Residential Area status removed. For reference we have attached a satellite screenshot of the marsh and the local plan map 'maps.pdf'

WGSA wishes for the area's large scale country parks, woodlands, local nature reserves, golf courses, playing fields and public rights of way, to be accessible to everyone in the future.

The whole of the remaining undeveloped coastline is protected from development by national and international designations for nature conservation and most of the inland fields no foreshores are used by overwintering birds at high tide. Understanding that half of our national annual carbon emissions are from buildings means that the management of how development comes forward is crucial in moving toward net zero carbon.

as precise as possible.	WGSA is broadly supportive of the focus of the local plan on the energy hierarchy, the role of passive design, retrofitting, targets of energy efficiency; avoidance of overheating; performance monitoring; post occupancy monitoring; and renewable energy. In addition, water efficiency will save energy and manage water resources properly.
	For all its support on matters of sustainability, WGSA views the location and quantity of housing and jobs to be crucial to the local plan enabling sustainable development, hence our effort to reduce the quantum of housing and jobs to 'needed' rather than 'developer demanded' (see representations for WS 1.1 Housing need and WS1.2 Employment need) and the sequential approach of focusing new development in existing areas due to the accessibility and proximity to existing infrastructure. Loss of land in rural areas is unsustainable (per capita) due to the need for additional journeys to access services and employment, school etc.
	Carbon fixation is an environmental net gain and it ought to be a consideration when considering whether to grant permission for new development. This has particular relevance to the development of greenfield sites. These alterations are proposed to strengthen the effectiveness of the Plan in tackling climate change.
	WGSA echo the comments under Policy 8 made by Wirral Wildlife concerning existing carbon function of land. Where land presently stores carbon, this needs accounting for. Development of peat is prohibited in the Framework, but the local plan should support the conservation of land use that are beneficial to carbon storage and support the conservation of mossland and other natural infrastructure such as woodland and trees. Also, new development should be encouraged to include in the design more surface areas to be naturalised, such as features such as green roofs, green walls, SuDs features, etc. There are also concerns about the use of hydrogen from natural gas in terms of its carbon footprint.
	WGSA also echo the comments by John Heath of ITPAS on limiting higher density and high-rise buildings (being encourage through an inflated 'Housing Need') and agree that an increased provision with commercial and larger residential developments of Basements would reduce land-take, increase the proportion and attraction of areas between buildings and reduce the energy required to heat/cool buildings whilst increasing their capital value, a strategy widely and successfully used abroad.
	Higher Density of Developments: Paras 3.30 et seq and et al, Policies WS 3.2, 7.1 and 9.3:
	Higher Density of Developments: This is mentioned in this section of the DLP (Para 3.30 et seq and et al) and in more detail later (Policy WS 3.2) as a necessity for complying with the NPPF aim of 'Making effective use of land' and the sufficiency of the availability of developable 'brownfield' sites, although that is not a problem on Wirral where the scale of such 'brownfield' land is of national significance.
	ITPAS and WGSA contend that in part the proposed higher densities of development (particularly of housing) are proposed to address the very significantly exaggerated 'Housing Need' and 'Housing Requirement' figures. The resulting overly-high densities proposed are unnecessary and would be detrimental to the character of Wirral's towns and villages (with the possible exception of Birkenhead and other main Regeneration areas) and to the quality of life, the space between buildings and wellbeing of residents.
	Higher densities coupled with the call for more internal space in homes (to take account of increased incidence of working and learning from home) plus more local greenspaces and open 'blue' and 'green' spaces, and increased walking, cycling and public transport routes can all only be achieved by building higher, which has not been proven to be beneficial for residents and would change the built environment and character of towns and villages. The better solution would be a more realistic (lower) level of additional homes and a lesser drive to increased densities. The reasons for this are: 1) The Castlefields Estate (the Estate) in Leasowe (see Appendix A for geographic extent) has been in residential use since the 1920s and has more in common, in land-use terms, with the primarily residential areas on the opposite side of Leasowe Road than with the market garden and other agricultural businesses in the adjacent green belt;

as precise as possible.	2) The Castlefields Estate does not meet all of the purposes of designating green belt, as set out in paragraph 138 of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), namely:
	a) To check the unrestricted urban sprawl of large built-up areas. The Estate has discrete boundaries and was already developed when the green belt was first established (see Appendix B for 1926 and 1935 Ordnance Survey plans). So, the Estate makes no contribution to fulfilling this purpose;
	b) To prevent neighbouring towns merging into one another. There is nothing beyond the Estate apart from a golf course and Liverpool Bay. So, the Estate makes no contribution to fulfilling this purpose;
	c) To assist in safeguarding the countryside from encroachment. The Estate was laid out sometime before 1925. It has had a residential use ever since and its discrete boundaries mean that encroachment into the countryside could not take place, so it makes no contribution to fulfilling this purpose;
	d) To preserve the setting and special character of historic towns. The closes historic town is Chester, so the Estate cannot fulfil this purpose, and
	e) To assist in urban regeneration, by encouraging the recycling of derelict and other urban land. The Estate is previously developed land and many of the owners have implemented permitted development-led schemes that have improved their homes. As the Estate was already in residential use when the green belt was originally designated, the contribution that the Estate can make to fulfilling this purpose is limited unless the Government were to decide to remove permitted development rights from owners of property in the green belt. Thus, this is the only purpose of the green belt that the site can contribute to and the value of this contribution is limited.
	3) Some of the properties on the Estate are unfit for human habitation (see Appendix C for an example of an unaltered dwelling), but the council still rigorously applies green belt policies in the face of reasonable requests to replace them with dwellings that meet modern standards of insulation and structural integrity. This may be a breach of the Article 8 Rights of occupants because they are denied decent living conditions.
	4) So, in terms of NPPF paragraph 143:
	a) Ensure consistency with the development plan's strategy for meeting identified requirements for sustainable development. The Estate is previously developed land and a continued residential use is therefore sustainable. Preventing owners from developing their properties and sterilising the land for development is likely to lead to abandonment and dereliction and some limited opportunity for intensification of the existing residential use would be consistent with the council's policy of increasing density in existing residential areas;
	b) Not include land which it is unnecessary to keep permanently open. The Estate has been in residential use since the existing planning system came into being on 1 July 1948. As outlined above, it makes only a very limited contribution to fulfilling one of the five purposes of designating green belts. Consequently, it is unnecessary for the Estate to be included within the green belt;
	c) Where necessary, identify areas of safeguarded land between the urban area and the Green Belt, in order to meet longer-term development needs stretching well beyond the plan period. This criterion is not relevant;
	d) Make clear that the safeguarded land is not allocated for development at the present time. Planning permission for the permanent development of safeguarded land should only be granted following an update to a plan which proposes the development. This criterion is not relevant;
	e) Be able to demonstrate that Green Belt boundaries will not need to be altered at the end of the plan period. The long-established and discrete boundaries of the Estate have not changed since before 1925 and will not change by the end of the plan period, and
	f) Define boundaries clearly, using physical features that are readily recognisable and likely to be permanent. The long-established and discrete boundaries of the Estate have not changed since before 1925 and are readily recognisable.
	5) In terms of planning positively to enhance the beneficial use of the green blet, as required by NPPF paragraph 145, the Estate is in private ownership and there is no scope for providing access to the countryside; to provide opportunities for outdoor sport and recreation, or to retain and enhance landscapes, visual amenity and biodiversity. There is scope to improve damaged and derelict land dues to abandonment but it is primarily the council's rigid application of green belt policy that prevents this. Given the size of the remaining existing dwellings, the 15% limit on the increase in size of dwellings in the Unitary Development Plan is insufficient to deliver acceptable living conditions in most cases. This leads to sprawling permitted development-led schemes, which do not make the best use of the opportunity to improve visual amenity and biodiversity or to improve damaged and derelict land.

We have serious concerns with this plan as it designates New Brighton as a "Broad location for housing growth" The plan commits New Brighton to deliver 315 new homes over the next 15 years. To put this is context the plan commits Hoylake, Meols, West Kirby, Newtown, Caldy, Irby, Thingwall, Pensby, Heswall and Gayton between them to deliver a total of 92 homes. Liscard is to deliver 200 homes, Seacombe 1,240 homes and Wirral Waters 3,300 homes. Other large areas for housing development are Birkenhead and Bromborough which between them have to deliver many thousands. As you can see over 90% of the housing is set to be built in some of the more deprived areas of the Borough and a lot of it is in New Brighton or on our doorstep

	However, our main concern is New Brighton and where these homes will be built. In almost every other area it is clearly stated where the housing development will take place. For New Brighton it states where 55 units will be but then is states that the other 250 will be in "other developable area's" We met with Keith Keeley and Hannah Austin in April and they were unable or unwilling to tell us which sites were being considered for these housing units. I then emailed them last week and Hannah replied that the New Brighton Neighbourhood Framework was delayed due to capacity issues. I emailed our 3 ward Councillor's last week and Councillor Paul Martin replied that they do not have a confirmed list of sites yet but that they did have some meetings with Officers where they gave some feedback but they are still waiting for the final draft of the Masterplan!!
	And there in lies the problem!! We are supposed to agree to the Local Plan and trust that the Council will do the right thing by us when they finally get around to the New Brighton Neighbourhood Framework!!
	We cannot accept this as we believe the only way you can fit 315 new housing units into an already very heavily developed New Brighton is to build on our Green Spaces. Why as a community should we agree to something and then wait to see what we are agreeing to?
	What about the dismal transport links to New Brighton? What about the Schools and GP's and Dentists to cope with the extra demand that further housing will place on these services. What about things for the kids to do, places for them to play safely
