Whils the following is reference this piece of land- on which sits a farm commonly known as Appleby's Farm, no doubt other residents facing similar planning worries on green belts by them will also feel the same, so my follwoing comments apply to ALL green belt land subject to planning applications from the aforementioned estate. The Council has demonstrated the Borough's housing needs can be met via the housing supplied on brownfield sites across the Borough. There is no need to release any Green Belt land. Please protect our greenbelts against the likes of Leverhulme who only have greed at the heart of their plans. This is a copy of the email I sent to the estate last August, to which I have had no reply. i have also seen the proganda spin by the estate in local news publications, to whom i also emailed for definition on reply: Good Afternoon I write as a concerned and frustrated resident in Greeaby. I am on expert in Greenbelts, nor am I a conservationist, scientist or an expert on wildlife. I do have a family member though who worked many years in the labs at Unilever, and I am aware of the respect many people of the Wirral, particularly those residing in Port Sunlight, hold in regards to 'Levers' and what Wr. Lever did for the people in terms of providing work and a place to live for the workers, creating a community and a legacy, as well of course the company as it is now and the various associated brand names. However, it came to my attention a couple of weeks ago that surveyors, commissioned by the Leverhulme Estate, attended Appleby Farm on Arrow Road, Greasby a couple of weeks ago. Furthermore, I have learn that the Leverhulme Estate, which owns a va

The vast majority of people who choose to work, do so to make money to feed their family and put a roof over their heads. If they are wise or earn enough money or are very lucky, trips within the UK are a bonus as are ventures abroad and materialistic items such as gadgets and nice cars.

I get it that it is Leverhulme Estate land and the Estate should be able to do what it wants with it- maybe the Estate urgently requires money. But this is greenbelt land and is classified as such for a reason. For instance, you have the farmer at Appleby Farm who has refused a substantial amount of money to leave the land as generations of that family have worked there and continue to work on the farm and it is still his wish that he can pass the work down to his children. Not only is the farm the only one on Wirral which produces unpasteurised milk, it is home to all sorts of wildlife and is a great and important part of the community. We should be encouraging as many farms as possible to sell produce- not destroy them. If this land is sold, it would adversely affect the livelihoods of the farmer's family and potentially their state of mind. Surely him refusing to go tells you all you need to know about their characters and mindset- i urge you to adopt the same view.

Clearly money is not the be all and end all in their minds, otherwise the farmer and his family would have long gone. Developing the land and adding houses and roads will have an adverse impact on the environment. If, say, 500 houses were built, there would be at least an extra 500 cars on the roads in the area. Then of course there would be at least an extra 500 people minimum who would require the use of GP's and schools. Although selling would be of monetary benefit to you and the developers, It would be disastrous for the infrastructure of the area, and in my view would turn it into a 'concrete jungle.'

I ask you to consider this. What would Mr. Lever think? A speculative question I know but, surely having built his legacy which continues to last to this present day, he would have been happy with what he had and maybe have imparted his entrepreneourial skills onto others or advised or assisted with development in other parts of the Wirral which clearly require it?

I'm sure you'll be asking 'but there's no money to be made in such a scenario for the Estate' - true, but surely we just need to take a step back, take stock of what we have, be happy with what we have, and help others? I know lockdown has allowed a lot of people to reflect in such a way.

I implore you to do the same- please don't damage the legacy Mr. Lever has created- why not visit deprived areas of the Wirral and help re generate those instead- such areas quite often stay in the cycle of depravity- but with your expert knowledge this is a great chance to build on the legacy.

I hope you do read this- it would be appreciated- and I am welcome to meet up or chat over the phone to discuss a way forward that is going to keep the people of Greaby happy.

WS1.1 Housing/Homes The local plan specifies a requirement of 12,464 dwellings in the 16- year period, 2021 – 2037, or 779 pa. This is based on the DLUHC standard method and using the 2014 household projections, for the ten- year period 2020- 2030, and includes an affordability uplift. These data are well out of date, with successive projections based on 2016 and 2018, the latter having been available in September 2020.Further, the 2020 projections will be available by September, during the course of this local plan process. Later ONS projections make a material difference to the "housing need", varying between 29% and 42% lower than the Local Plan's stated need. The Council has failed to examine whether there are circumstances to depart form the 2014 projections and also failed to accommodate the advice of its own commissioned research from Manchester University ("An Objective assessment of the latest ONS Household projections for Wirral Metropolitan Borough" by Prof L Simpson, University of Manchester, 21/12/2018)

	which explained the requirement to use the most recent projections available for Wirral. The guidance for local plan inspection is that the plan must be based on up-to-date evidence (para 5.2). This submission draft of the local plan has not done that. Further, the SHMA October 2021 dismisses the projections other than the 2014-based ones (para 4.29). There is no full explanation why and the SHMA appears predicated on using the 2014-based projections because the DLUHC expects them to be used. This approach appears to take the 2014 projections as "pre-conceived" and organise the report around that.
	However, the plan gives an estimated supply of 16,522 units which exceeds the "need" (13,360 in para 3.15) by about 3,200. Further, the plan increases the "need" to nearly 18,000 dwellings because "sites may not come forward at the pace expected". This includes an arbitrary jump of 10% in parts of supply not specified in the NPPF. In the event of issues with the supply of deliverable sites for development, the NPPF argues for allocations to be brought forward, or for careful monitoring and subsequent action plans – not arbitrary additions.
	In effect, the plan's "housing need" is overstated due to out-of-date demographic evidence, and arbitrary extra supply and additions not required by the NPPF.
	The main point of a substantial paper appended to this box/form is that the 2014 based projections for 2020 to 2030 are based on old demographic changes in population (up to 2014), and headship rates prevailing at the time. The later 2018 based projections utilise estimates of population change up to 2018. In the later period, the components of natural change (births less deaths) and internal migration (flows of people between LAs) – either exhibit a change in trend or continue in a trend to result in a different impact on projected change in population overall – 2020 to 2030. Competent projection would take the later demographic change into account. These changes impact on the overall "housing need" substantially, reducing the projected need by at least 29%.
	The local plan adds to the 2014 based projection of 779 pa, an economic uplift of 6 pa, and a demolition uplift of 50 pa. The result is 835 pa, or 13,360 dwellings in the 16 years of the plan.
	The appended paper demonstrates that the 2018 based population (and household) projection extends the recent demographic change more realistically than those based on 2014 which mislead the levels and trends of recent change, particularly on natural change.
	The ONS 2018 based projection based on ONS's estimation using 5 years of recent internal migration data gives a projected need of 550 pa (8,800 in 16 years). Call this the ONS 2018 (5 year) projection. Further, the allowance for demolitions is overstated, and is more realistic at 40 pa. The consequent housing need, 596 pa, varies substantially from the plan. The 16-year need would then be 9,536 dwellings – some 29% lower than the plan's 13,360.
	Projections come with assumptions and methods of estimation. Some demographers would argue that ten years of internal migration data reduces the impact of economic cycles on population projections and makes for very stable estimation. The resulting ONS 2018 (10 year) projection is for 435 dwellings pa (with affordability uplift). Addition of the economic and demolition uplifts (6+40) gives 481 dwellings pa or 7,696 in 16 years. This level is 42% less than the plan's "housing need".
	The range of "housing need" – 7,696 to 9,536 - gives flexibility to accommodate other material changes in circumstances while being based on recent demographic change.
	The appended paper explains the benefits and issues with these projections in more detail. What is clear is that the 2014 based projections are misleading for Wirral and make statistically unrealistic projections. The recent population changes and consequent later 2018 population and household projections give a substantial variation to merit a departure from the 2014 basis.
	Such variation (reduction) is likely to continue, reflecting longer term changes in England's population. The projected change in England's population between 2020 and 2030 is 3.66 million (2014 based); 2.84 million (2016 based); 2.50 million (2018 based); and 1.99 million (2020 based). ONS published preliminary 2020- based population projections for England in January 2022.
	The projected increases in England's population (2020 to 2030) get progressively lower with each new set of projections, reflecting longer term demographic change. This is likely to be reflected in the next set (2020- based) of projected population changes (and household change) for Wirral.
	The appended paper also demonstrates that the 2018 -based projected number of households (5 year and 10 year) are close to the recent numbers of observed households in occupied dwelling stock: whereas those of 2014-based overstate household numbers in dwellings even when retro-fitted back to 1991. The projected number of households for 2020 from the 2014 based projections is over 2,000 more than the actual number from the local authority records.

WS3.4 Housing - Housing Mix Examination of the projected changes in numbers of households by type and age, suggest that any new dwellings should be weighted towards adult households and the elderly: that is towards 1 or 2 bed dwellings, bungalows and flats. Over 70% of the projected change in households in 2020 to 2037will be from those with just one or two people. And these smaller households are dominated by households headed by people aged 60+. This holds for 2014 and 2018 based projected households. The 2018 based household projections (5 year and 10 year) suggest also that the need for 3- bedroom houses may not be as great as suggested in the various scenarios given by the SHMA. This reflects the projected reduction in households with children.

	In the plan's period, 2021-37, both population projections, 2014 based and 2018 based, project an increase of over 13,000 in the number of older households (Household Representative Person is 60+). Both projections also project a drop in the number of households below 60. Elderly households dominate the projected change. A point on accuracy here is that the Local Plan refers to 14,316 households headed by someone aged 65+ (para 3.44, p62 and refers to the SHMA para 5.8, p98). This figure is clearly inconsistent with the projected change in households aged 60+ in the Technical Appendix D, table D2A, p34, which gives a projected change of 13,041 such households 60+. This discrepancy brings into question other facts which, alongside the sparsity of detail of the household survey, casts doubt on how the results can be interpreted.
	The 2014 projections give an increase in households with children while those of 2018 give a reduction.
	The 2014 household projection appears out of line against the gradual reduction in number of births since about 2008 & 2009 in Wirral. The latest evidence points to more accommodation for the elderly, and households with one or two people. In order to project forward the mix of households by type and size, it is critical to use the latest demographic evidence – the 2018 household projections for now – whatever overall target number is used.
	The appended paper gives the detailed argument that the recommendation on household mix by size of dwelling seems inconsistent with the increase in households headed by 60+ people, and the reduction in households with children from the later household projections. While, a refined mix cannot be calculated because of the sparsity of detail in the SHMA Technical Appendix D, it is clear that the mix should prioritise more 2- bedroom properties, flats and bungalows. The SHMA states that elderly households wish to remain in their own homes but those who wish to move require smaller and easier to maintain dwellings and bungalows (para 3.44, p62) (SHMA Technical Annex F, para F43, p95).
	Further, across Wirral, figure F3 (p93 of the appendix F) shows: 68.5% of older households (65+) live in houses, 12.9% in bungalows, and 18.1% in flats. If most want to remain in their homes but those who wish to move, want to move to smaller dwellings, then the broad implication is a need for 2 -bedroom flats, and more bungalows for ease of mobility. Paragraph F31 states that 60.2% of older households (65+) live in 3- bedroom houses which contradicts figure F3 where the percentage is given as 40.5%. if these statistics are taken by users then misinterpretation may occur.
	Further, it raises the issue that the SHMA October 2021 should give full detail of the analysis on which its recommendations on dwelling size are based. At least, this means providing the full relationship between households and dwellings. The SHMA relies on a survey of households in 2019. The SHMA gives insufficient case detail and statistics from this survey in order to inform interpretation of the selected results given in the SHMA report. More justification is required.
	In addition, the SHMA fails to give the average household size for Wirral from the 2019 household survey. It would be instructive to compare the average household size from the survey with the projected average household sizes for 2019 from the ONS household projections (2014 and 2018 based).

Therefore buildings should be at least 40m from the nearest trees (the height of most UK trees when mature – Ash and Lime can grow taller). Garden space could extend nearer, but to buffer the LWS against effects of pesticides, fertilisers and human activity generally, there should be a maintained buffer of semi-natural vegetation of at least 20m and preferably 30m width between gardens and the LWS. 	According to our flood map, the square of land north of Ditton Lane at SJ 259 914 has a "low" likelihood of flooding, i.e. at risk from a flood event of between 1 in a 100 years (1%) and 1 in a 1000 years (0.1%). The reason flood risk is low is because this area benefits from:
	the Wirral Council Wallasey Embankment, protecting the square of land from the sea during a tidal storm surge.
	the EA flood embankment immediately to the south of Ditton Lane, protecting the square of land from the River Birket.
	the EA flood embankment running north to south from Leasowe Common, behind and immediately west of Pasture Farm, all the way to the River Birket. This protects the square of land from the River Birket and flooding from the sea during an extreme tidal storm surge (over the Wallasey Embankment).
	Of course, these defences can fail or be overtopped, which is why this square of land at SJ 259 914 remains at risk of flooding.
	However, the land now frequently has a shallow water body on it for much of the year.
	Since the land immediately south of Ditton lane (now Ditton Lane LWS is an EA flood relief basin, any development on this field would need to be very careful about fulfilling flood measures including Policy WS 5.4 section 3.2.
