Section 2: What Council proposal is being assessed?

On the 22nd of May 2020 HM Government requested individual COVID-19 Outbreak Plans to be developed by all Councils by 30th June 2020.

Wirral Council published the local Outbreak Management Plan on the Council Website: www.wirral.gov.uk/covid19outbreak

The Local Outbreak Management Plan covers seven themes summarised below:

- 1. Care Homes and Schools
- 2. High Risk Workplaces, Communities and Locations
- 3. Mobile Testing Units & Local Testing approaches
- 4. Contact Tracing in Complex Settings
- 5. Data Integration
- 6. Vulnerable People
- 7. Local Boards

The Outbreak Management Plan will ensure there is provision in place to support vulnerable local people to get help to self-isolate (e.g. encouraging neighbours to offer support, identifying relevant community groups, planning how to co-ordinate and deploy) and ensuring services meet the needs of diverse communities.

Councils are required to establish governance structures led by existing Covid-19 Health Protection Boards and supported by existing strategic co-ordination groups (gold command forums) and a new member-led Board to communicate with the general public, both locally and at the Combined Authority (Merseyside Resilience Forum) level.

There is a proposal to develop the local structure and governance of outbreak management for all outbreaks, but specifically in relation to COVID-19. The Council is proposing to set up a Health Protection Board and Outbreak Management Board by August 2020.

Public Health guidance, research findings relating to protected groups or vulnerable groups will be factored into any planning and response for outbreak management.

Wirral Intelligence Service undertakes local and regional analysis and research and supports the outbreak management cells/boards to provide insight.

We use local intelligence to develop our response to prevent outbreaks and protective measures and to inform the local testing strategy.

We will implement an information system to ensure that national, regional, and local information flows enable effective case management and outbreak prevention, control, and management.

The Council has engaged with community members to receive valuable feedback from the BAME COVID-19 support group. The Council will continue to engage regularly with the BAME COVID-19 support group to work in partnership in our local response to delivering the Outbreak Management Plan. Through the robust partnerships established with the community and voluntary sector and key organisations as part of the Humanitarian Cell, the Council has been able to ensure that Wirral's COVID-19 response has swiftly responded with mitigating action in respect of residents with protected characteristics and this approach to engagement and regular review of activity will continue.
