COVID-19 alert level: National lockdown - Stay at Home

The number of people testing positive for COVID-19 is currently showing extremely large increases.

There is widespread community transmission (e.g. between family members), with new positive COVID-19 cases being seen each day across Wirral and in all age groups.

The current level of **1,965 cases per week (in the 7 days to 1 January 2021, the most recent day for which figures are complete).**

The latest weekly rate of **COVID-19 in Wirral is 556 per 100,000 population** while the **latest positivity rate is 17.7%** (percentage of positive tests of all tests carried out in the last 7 days).

By 10-year age band, the largest percentage number of cases in the **7-days to 01/01/2021 were in those aged those aged 20-29 (19%),** then those **aged 30-39 (17.5%),** followed by those **aged 50-59 (16.5%)** and those **aged 40-49 (15.5%).** **Over two-thirds of cases this week were in these age bands (see table below).**

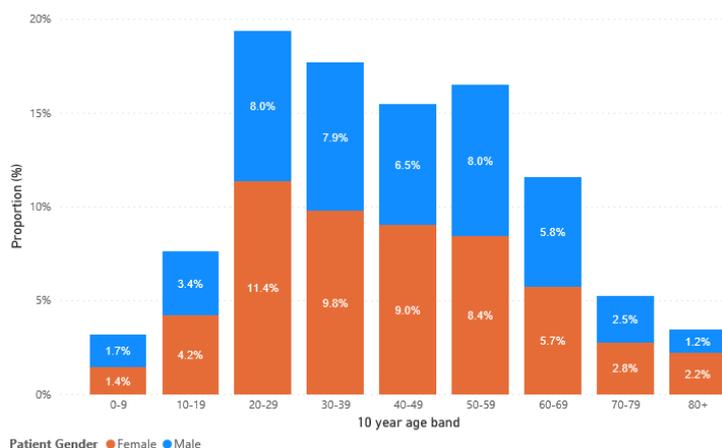
There were slightly more cases in women compared to men in the **7-days to 01/01/2021; 54.5% female, 45% male and 0.5% unknown.**

The wards with the largest number of confirmed cases (**in the 7-days to 01/01/2021**) were **Oxton (134), Bebington (121) and Moreton West and Upton (112),** (see table below).

The ethnicity of confirmed cases (**in the 7-days to 01/01/2021**) was **83% White British, 11% unknown and 6% from BAME and/or mixed heritage backgrounds.**

Weekly data from ONS (**published on 06/01/2021**) showed there had been **69 registered deaths in Wirral, of which 12% (or 8 in actual numbers) were COVID-19 deaths.**

To protect yourself and others, you must:

- Wash your hands with soap and water often, and as soon as you get home. Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water is not available
- Stay at least 2 metres away from anyone you do not live with, or who is not in your support bubble
