

## Wirral COVID-19 Report

### COVID-19 alert level: Roadmap Stage 2 - Reopening Safely

The number of people testing positive for COVID-19 in Wirral is now **lower than during the peak month of January, but the virus remains a serious threat.**

There is still community transmission (e.g., between family members), with new positive COVID-19 cases being seen each day across Wirral and in nearly all age groups.

The current level of **33 cases per week** (in the 7 days to 10/04/2021), the most recent day for which figures are complete.

The latest weekly rate of **COVID-19 in Wirral is 9.3 per 100,000 population** while the **latest positivity rate is 0.3%** (percentage of positive tests of all PCR tests carried out in the last 7 days).

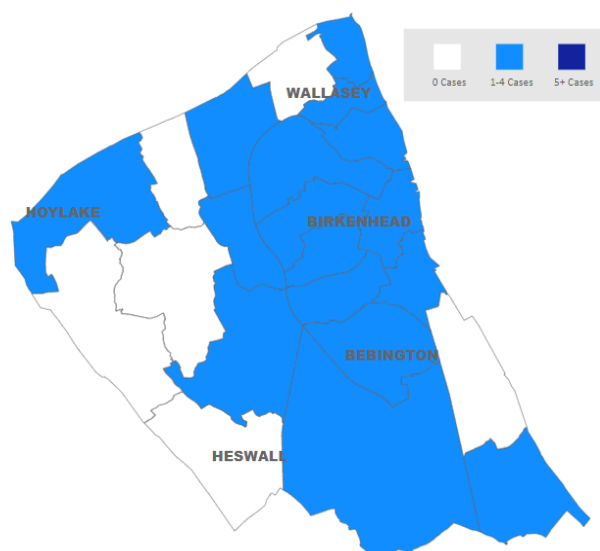
By age band, the percentage number of cases in the 7-days to 10/04/2021 **were in those aged 0-19 (24.2%), 20-59 (69.7%) and those aged over 60 (6.1%),** see table below.

There were more cases in women compared to men in the 7-days to 10/04/2021; **66.7% female and 33.3% male.**

The ethnicity of confirmed cases (in the 7-days to 10/04/2021) **was 84.9% White British with 15.1% as combined unknown cases and BAME and/or mixed heritage backgrounds** (categories have been combined to protect individual confidentiality).

Weekly ONS data (published on 13/04/2021) **showed 58 registered deaths in Wirral, of which 5.2% (or 3 in actual numbers) were COVID-19 deaths. Total deaths from COVID-19 in Wirral are now 969.**

The wards with **'No confirmed Covid-19 cases'** (in the 7-days to 10/04/2021) were **Bromborough, Greasby, Frankby and Irby, Heswall, Moreton West and Saughall Massie, Wallasey and West Kirby & Thurstaston** (lightest colour on map opposite) **with all other Wards having less than 5 cases** (see table on page 2).

### To protect yourself and others, you must:

- Wash your hands with soap and water often, and as soon as you get home. Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water is not available.

- **If you are contacted by Wirral's Test and Trace team, then please follow their instructions. If you have symptoms of coronavirus you must self-isolate, get a test; stay at home until you get a result; your household or support bubble must also stay at home until you get your result.**
