

The Breck, Wallasey - access statement

The main entrance to The Breck is on Breck Road. Access from this entrance is via either steps with hand rail or a ramp which runs to the rear of houses in Breck Road. There is ample public car parking via Breck Road, Millthwaite Road and Knaresborough Road.

There are two further primary entrances (on Millthwaite Road and Knaresborough Road respectively). These entrances are suitable for disabled access, cyclists and pedestrians.

The pedestrian entrance situated on Breck Road—To the left of the entrance a large raised bed, which is currently being transformed into a memorial garden containing ornamental shrubs, and a large sandstone pier mark the entrance to the park. A small but smart and clean sign is in situ on the sandstone pier. Another sign reading 'Welcome to The Breck' is situated on a tall metal frame installed in the shrub bed adjacent to the entrance.

The stepped area has a flagpole from which the Green Flag is flown prominently.

Millthwaite Road entrance – There is an attractive noticeboard erected at this entrance to welcome visitors and to provide information and interpretation about The Breck. Perimeter fencing distinguishes the park's boundary and vehicle access is prevented by a locked drop bollard that can be removed to allow access to maintenance vehicles. The entrance leads to a well surfaced tarmac path.

Knaresborough Road entrance – There is an attractive noticeboard erected close to this point to welcome visitors and to give information and interpretation about The Breck, volunteer opportunities and park and community events. Vehicle access is prevented by a bollard. The entrance leads to a well surfaced tarmac path.
